WORKSHOP 1 - Supporting practitioner development of CSP consultation skills in practice

All practitioners have a varying level of experience and ability to use care and support planning consultation skills. This workshop will focus on how we might better support practitioners to develop their care and support planning consultation skills following training.

WORKSHOP 2 - How do we know CSP conversations are happening? (Fidelity and evaluation)

If we believe the purpose of care and support planning is to change the type of conversation that people have, then finding ways to describe what should be happening and having ways to measure or evaluate this could be important

WORKSHOP 3 - The dilemmas and difficulties of including multiple long term conditions in a CSP conversation

Care and support planning is a process that focuses on the person and not just the conditions that they have. However some practitioners find running care and support planning consultations for people with multiple conditions very challenging. In this workshop we will debate the perceived barriers and challenges around conversations with people who live with multiple long term conditions.

WORKSHOP 4 - The RCGP curriculum – CSP for GP trainers. What needs to happen next?

The RCGP have announced their intention to include CSP within the new GP curriculum. In this workshop we will

- explore issues and ideas in relation to providing GP trainees in Year of Care practices with an positive experience of care and support planning
- consider what GP trainers might need and share some newly developed resources

WORKSHOP 5 - The dilemmas and difficulties of including medicines management in a CSP conversation

Medicines management is a core component of good practice in primary care. In this workshop we will debate

- the different levels of medicines management and how they fit in and around CSP
- practical solutions and options around completing medicines management in a meaningful way that balances and complements CSP

WORKSHOP 6 - How can our learning from care and support planning influence other consultations?

People with long term conditions will experience many other clinical interactions and consultations beyond CSP. In this session we will:

- Consider what skills and processes are relevant outside of the setting of CSP
- Explore whether and how the context influences these
- Discuss the implications to training and support of clinicians beyond the CSP team
